IOM's primary aims are to prevent trafficking in persons and to protect them from the trade while offering survivors of trafficking options of safe and sustainable reintegration and/or return to their home countries. IOM offers comprehensive direct assistance packages to survivors of trafficking in collaboration with IOM's government and civil society partners. This includes accommodation in places of safety, medical and psychosocial support, skills development, vocational training, legal support and counselling. IOM also assists with voluntary, safe and dignified return to countries of origin, integration in the country of destination or resettlement to third countries when needed.
